If it isn't, and it really contains the BK's phone number, then I expect decoding will need some information gathered from the rest of the book. After all, it uses an encoding scheme similar to the 3rd invitation, and the letters after GRAIL KEEPER are P*XKT (* is different) and therefore the rest of the decoding can be linked to the 1st invitation. This makes me think that we might have to combined the three decoding methods used in the invitations, perhaps in an "opposite" manner.</p> <p>Anyway, if the first part decodes as "GRAIL KEEPER IN UK", this leaves only 11 letters to work with. Not much, and the number of possible "correct" solution is huge. For example, we could just type the remaining 11 letters on a phone, using 1=ABC, etc. I believe that you could go on and on and on looking for a solution, and the only way you have for knowing that the solution is correct is to actually dial the number. This simply doesn't make sense to me.</p> <p>The method that consists in applying the three decoding schemes from the invitations is I think quite promising. The first 11 letters are GRAIL KEEPER. The next 5 are from the first invitation. We are left with 10 letters, which could possibly result in 5 digits (the opposite of 10 digits that give 5 letters, as in the second invitation)</p> <p>Dr Liebchen</p>
