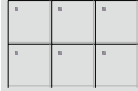



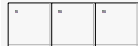

PS. And by the way, some say that Hector (or Ector) is one of the knights, and we have one such. But I don ´t know which one he should replace in the list I found.



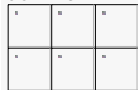

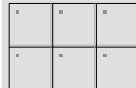

It's time for just an update (nothing new here!) for the identification of the main characters in the book.

DrLiebchen, Ravn2, muggle and Iseult have posted the above information. Moreover, on the t4q bulletin board, Chris posted some additional info as well.

We can make the following identifications:

Character - Identification

Richard Fisher --- Rich Fisher = fisher king = Grail Keeper

Sophia Joseph --- the templar goddess Sophia, and Joseph of Arimathea

Lancelot Glass --- Sir Lancelot  
Paulo Luccini ---- Sir Lucan  
Lionel Fabre ----- Sir Lionel  
Hector Wise ----- Sir Ector de Maris  
Michael Pell ----- Sir Pelleas  
Gavin Mount ----- Sir Gawaine  
Hugh Gallagher --- Sir Galahad  
Gareth Llewellyn -- Sir Gareth  
Steven Kay ----- Sir Kay  
Simon Perceval --- Sir Percivale  
Tristram Cecil ----- Sir Tristan  
Guillaume Clergue - unidentified  
Pierre Claremont -- unidentified

Note that now we have added names of Knights of the Round Table, that are not on the "short list" of Knights on the website that Ravn2 mentions, but instead we have turned to a longer list of 25 Knights as mentioned on the Winchester Round Table (<http://www.britannia.com/history/arthur/knights.html>). Clearly not all those 25 names reappear as characters in TUQ.

And as Chris mentions on the t4q bb, the Grail was given to the King Fisher/Rich Fisher by Joseph of Arimathia, who had a strange wound in the thigh region that would not heal, just

like Richard Fisher in the TUQ story!

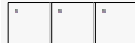

The only remaining character in the book is Guillaume Clergue. I couldn't trace his name in the list of Grand masters. However, a historic person with this name occurs in various documents of the early days of the Inquisition, from circa 1320. He was the father of Pierre Clergue, a priest of Montailou. I couldn't find out what religion this Clergue family had.
