Has anyone addressed the subject of the seemingly garbled text on the front of the tomb? I tried to superimpose some other sections of the sketch (by folding or rotating, for example) but nothing appears. However, what strikes me is this: did Richard encode some kind of message on the sketch, or is the message actually on the tomb? If it's on the tomb, then the folding/rotating/overlaying must not be done on the sketch, because the sketch represents a perspective view of the tomb. It must be done using what is on the tomb before the perspective view is applied, so a reverse perspective projection must be applied in order to get the right dimensions.

I don't have the software tools to do any skewing/stretching on a scanned image, but I already checked some ratios and it seems that the bird's eyes and the flower center points align pretty well if the long side of the tomb was folded in two. Any ideas? I'm going to try to get the right software and let you know what I find out.
