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

It's probably also just a big joke, in the sense that it is inspired from a lot of different stories, but that's mainly just for the fun of it. Have you heard about cryptic crosswords, where you have really weird definitions and you have to interpret the words in the definitions in a certain way to get the answer? I think the TUQ is similar: a bunch of little problems; when you know the answers they are obvious.

Don't go too deep into the religious stuff. Instead, look at the entire book and try to find patterns and things that are a bit odd (like all the mismatches and misspellings in the story, or the smaller frame of the Abbot list).
